Annual entrance scholarships of \$2,500 each are available at the [University of Saskatchewan](#) and at the [University of Regina](#). Applicants must be either a CAA Saskatchewan Member or child of a Member, and a Saskatchewan resident.

CAA scholarships for Saskatchewan students entering [Saskatchewan Polytechnic](#) are \$3,000 in total and include the Automotive Service Technician Program offered at the Saskatoon Campus (\$1,000) and at the Moose Jaw Campus (\$1,000), plus the Auto Body Technician Certificate Program (\$1,000) offered at the Regina Campus. The CAA scholarships at Saskatchewan Polytechnic are available April 1 to June 30th to CAA Saskatchewan Members and non-members.

Interested applicants are encouraged to contact the above mentioned post-secondary educational institution of their choice regarding application forms, scholarship availability, and selection process.
